

## 230,000 cats are ran over every year in the UK! We're changing that!

## STOP!

Never just drive off! An animal, and their owner, is counting on you to do the right thing. Your actions will be the difference between life, death and an owner having the closure they need. You might view them as "just a cat", but there's a good chance they will be someones companion and loved very much!

## HELP!

25% of car incidents involving cats are fatal, so there is a good chance the cat will survive if urgent care is given. Keep calm, and talk in reassuring tones to the cat, avoiding any sudden movements which could scare them further. In case of internal injury, lift the cat gently with one hand under the chin at the front of the chest, and the other supporting the hind quarters. Wrap a jacket/blanket around them to combat shock. Once stable and comfortable, the cat will need to see a veterinarian straight away

## REPORT IT!

If a cat is sadly deceased, check for a collar, or try knocking on neighbouring houses to locate an owner. A local vet or rescue will scan for a microchip, and your local council will collect the body. However, check the council will collect straight away and scan for a microchip. Posting details on local lost/found pages is also a good tool to help find and notify an owner.
